This year the 12th annual Wendell N. Rollason 5k Run, was held at 8 a.m. Saturday, April 2, at the Immokalee Community School. It was a rainy day, but this fact couldn't stop our runners!!! Everybody gave their best for our children.

This annual race, named after the longtime executive director of RCMA, raises money for child care and educational programs at RCMA's 70 centers and two

charter schools. Runners competed in 15 age groups, from children 9 and younger through seniors 70 and older. There were six winners (top three males and top three females) in each age group.

The winning time this year was 17 minutes and 12 seconds for first place male Perry Small of Cape Coral. The winning time of the first place female, Vonnie Smid, of Marco Island, Florida, was 19 minutes and 44 seconds. After the race, runners enjoyed refreshments of water, Gatorade, and post race food. Ricarda is currently a student attending Hardee Senior High School. She was recruited to our Teen Program at Fred Dennis as a pregnant teen. One of the obstacles she faced was residing with her mother, father and six siblings. It was a total of eleven living in the same household. Due to the other siblings having children of their own plus herself with her baby made it difficult for Ricarda to concentrate on her homework. She experienced another obstacle, in August of 2004 when her mobile home was damaged by Hurricane Charlie. She had to move in with her child's father and his family.

Ricardo's mother had to travel to Texas to receive chemotherapy and radiation as she was fighting a battle with cancer for three years. Unfortunately, her mother passed away January of 2005. I was there to support Ricarda through these tough times. Ricarda's goal was to complete school and attend college for a degree in Criminal Justice. I gave her a lot of resources to begin the process of her goals. She applied for financial assistance through the school and obtained the grant. She is currently employed at Acapulco Restaurant as a waitress. She is managing school, work and a one year old child. She will begin classes in June at Southwest Florida College for a degree in Criminal Justice, a two year program. She will be commuting back and forth from Zolfo Springs to Tampa three days a week. This is a 1 hour and 30 minute drive. She is willing to sacrifice in this way to begin her dreams. Even though Ricarda has had a lot of obstacles especially the loss of her mother she has managed to follow her dreams. I strongly commend her in all her efforts in pursuing her goal. Great job, Ricarda!!!



Ricarda Rodríguez es actualmente una estudiante que asiste a la Senior High School. Ella fue recrutada por el programa de adolescentes como una mama embarazada. Uno de los obstáculos que ella enfrento era el tener que vivir en la misma casa con su papa, mama y seis hermanos. Era un total de once personas viviendo en el mismo hogar. Debido a que otros hermanos tenían también hijos, además de ella con su pequeña, el poder concentrarse para estudiar y hacer la tarea era difícil para Ricarda. Otro obstáculo que ella tuvo en Agosto del 2004 fue que su casa móvil se vio dañada por el Huracán Charlie. Ella se tuvo que cambiar con el papa de la niña y su familia.

Su madre tuvo que irse a Texas para recibir quimioterapia y radiación ya que estaba luchando la batalla contra el cáncer que había durado tres años. Desafortunadamente, su madre murio en Enero del 2005.

Yo fui el apoyo de Ricarda durante todos estos tiempos difíciles. El objetivo de Ricarda era terminar la escuela y asistir al colegio para obtener un grado en Justicia Criminal. Le di muchos recursos para comenzar el proceso para alcanzar sus objetivos. Ella lleno el formato para solicitar una ayuda financiera a traves de la escuela y obtuvo esta beca. Ella actualmente trabaja como mesera en el restaurante Acapulco. Ella administra su tiempo entre el la escuela, el trabajo y un bebe de un año. Ella comenzara clases en Junio del 2005 en el Colegio del Suroeste de la Florida en el programa de Justicia Criminal que dura dos años. Ella estará transportándose desde Zolfo Springs a Tampa tres dias a la semana. Esta es distancia que manejava en 1 hora y 30 minutos. Ella esta dispuesta a sacrificar este tiempo de manejo para lograr sus sueños. Aun sabiendo que Ricarda ha tenido muchos obstáculos, especialmente la muerte de su madre, ella ha logrado seguir sus sueños. Yo la apoyo fuertemente en todos sus esfuerzos para conseguir sus metas. ¡Buen trabajo Ricarda!

We met at 6am on Sunday April 3rd to begin our journey. Once we arrived, we hung the many and various hand paintings from RCMA children throughout the state in the capitol. We hung the hands to remind legislators of the children's needs. We finished around 4 pm, and headed towards the mall for some recreational activities.

The following day we woke early enough to see the sunrise. We began our day by driving to the capital, and meeting several of the Senate President's aides, who helped arrange our meetings. At 1 pm we had a mock legislative session in the Senate chambers. Here we were treated to the rich history of the Florida state government, and we got to vote on our own proposed bills. Later we toured Florida State University, and were able to gain an appreciation of the university. Several students commented that this was a school that they like to attend some day. We topped off our day with Mexican food and a good movie.

On the final day we began by eating a hearty breakfast, and meeting at the Florida Supreme Court at 10am. We sat in on a capital punishment appeal, and were acknowledged by the chief justice. The students were left speechless after the oral arguments, and many commented that this was completely different than what they have seen on television. Later we were given an in-depth tour of the Supreme Court. We finished at around 1pm, and we began our trek back to Ruskin, tired but satisfied by such an enriching trip.

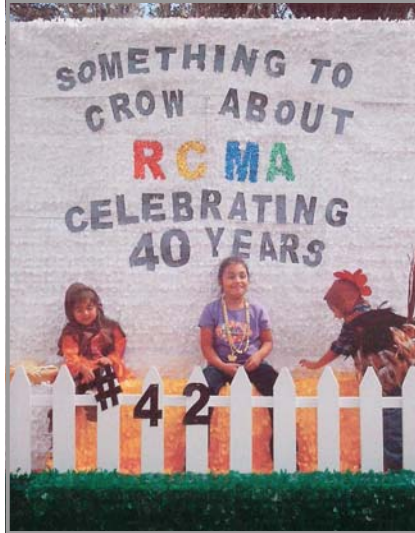
DADE CITY LEARNING CENTER OPENS
